
DORNOCH HERITAGE SOCIETY

WARTIME MEMORIES

The project focuses on wartime memories and in particular learning more about the people who are named on the war memorial. As I was doing my initial research I noted that there was very little in the museum about WW1 & WWII and the image library consisted mostly of photos of unnamed soldiers from WW1.

I realised that there was scope to find out more about how life changed in the Parish of Dornoch during the wars, e.g. the men and women who enlisted into the forces, the airbase outside Dornoch, home defence etc. It is important that Historylinks records wartime memories from those who were involved and their descendants. This information will form part of a new audio exhibition in the Historylinks Museum and will be archived and preserved for future generations.

An introductory talk in the autumn months will outline the aims of the project which will be closely followed by a programme of community workshops where participants can learn about how to research a wide range of wartime and local records.

Historylinks Museum would be delighted to hear from anyone who has photographs of those who participated in WW1 and WW2 or the area around Dornoch during the wars.
