Historylinks is a member of the VisitScotland Ancestral Tourism scheme and we welcome enquiries from people doing family history.

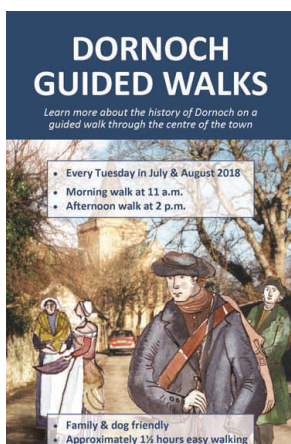

We had a great time showing 30 members of the Fort Augustus Heritage Group and 34 members of St Geraldine's High Church Friendship Group around the Museum.

It was also fantastic to have the students from Sinclair Community College, Ohio for a visit organised by North Highland College. They had a guided walk around Dornoch before visiting the Museum. Many of them are doing Nordic and Celtic studies and just loved the story of Sigurd the Viking!



LONGHOUSE PROJECT

A first-stage proposal has been made to the Heritage Lottery Fund for funding for our latest community project.

Our intention is to excavate the site of a Sutherland Longhouse and surrounding area. The project is in its very early stages but the good news is that we have identified a potential site and the land owner is keen for the project to go ahead.

In partnership with UHI we hope to secure funding that will enable us to involve school groups and local volunteers in this exciting plan. We will let you know as soon as we have any more information.
